

Form 1: Event Registration

The registration fee is 975 USD per person for this event. For those already attending the Jamboree as planning team member, IST, Contingent or Unit Staff the fee for attending the Baden-Powell Fellowship event is 450 USD. The fee for the additional overnight at the Royal Camp is 250 USD.

Please note that the closest airport is Ronneby Airport (*mainly served by flights from Stockholm*). The closest international airport is Copenhagen, Denmark. From the airport in Copenhagen there are direct trains to Ronneby every 2nd hour. On the 4th, a Scout reception desk in the Copenhagen airport will be available to assist you. Private transport can be arranged on request.

Form 2: Hotel Registration

The event hotel is Ronneby Brunn Spa Hotel in Ronneby. We have reserved a large number of double rooms to a cost of SEK 1750 a night. When needed some of these reservations can be transferred to single rooms to a cost of SEK 1100 a night. A credit card is needed to guarantee the reservation, but you will need to make the payment upon checkout.

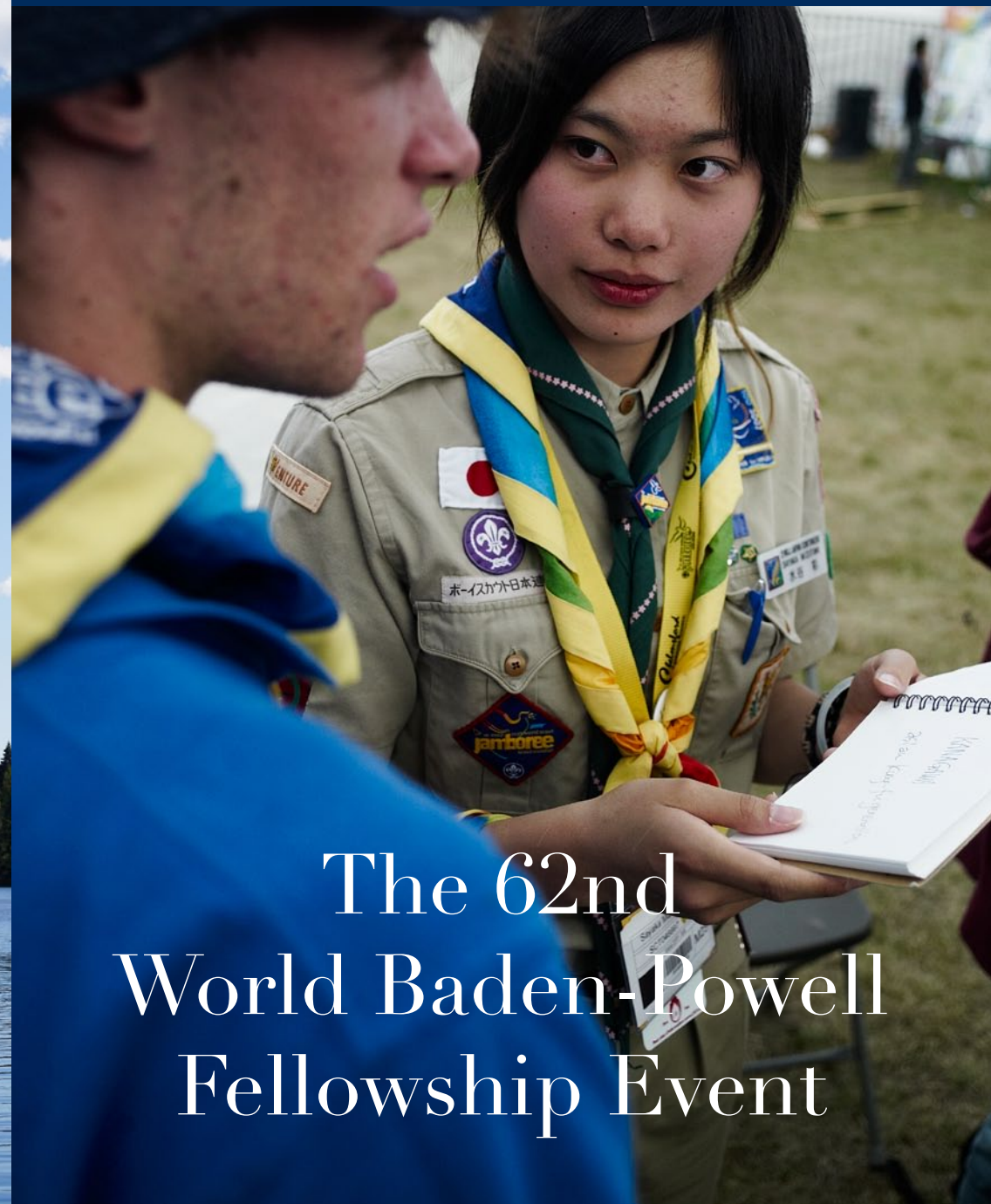

Program

Thursday August 4th

Arrival and registration of the guests at Ronneby Brunn Hotel, Spa and Resort.

In the late afternoon there will be a special session for members of the Regal Circle at Ovesholm Castle for which personal invitations will be sent out.

In the evening we will travel by buses to Ovesholm Castle (close to Kristianstad) for the Baden-Powell Fellowship dinner. The dress code for this dinner is: dark business suit.

The Castle of Ovesholm is a private estate that has belonged to the Count Hamilton family for generations and is located outside Kristianstad.

Friday August 5th

The Swedish Chapter and the 22nd World Scout Jamboree invite you to the very special opportunity to spend a full day at the vibrant World Scout Jamboree site.

This includes a welcome reception, a guided tour, lunch in the staff canteen, a visit to the official WSJ-souvenirs shop, dinner in the Royal Camp and more.

For those interested and for an additional fee, we are also very proud to give you the unique possibility to experience an overnight stay in a tent at the Royal Camp on the Jamboree site.

All the equipment you will need for this experience such as a tent, sleeping bag, sleeping mat (foam pad), towel and eating utensils will be provided.

All these items will afterwards be given to the Amahoro Amani project, a peace education project in the Great Lakes Region jointly run by the National Scout Organizations in Congo DRC, Rwanda and Burundi and the national Girl Guide organizations in these countries.

Saturday August 6th

Breakfast for those staying overnight in the Royal Camp.

For those that chose not to stay for an overnight at the Jamboree site there is an optional tour to the UNESCO World Heritage site of the city of Karlskrona. *(We will charge you a separate fee for this tour and a minimum number of participants is needed for us to be able to offer this.)*
